

Dependent Verification Requirements

Instructions

Submit copies of all proper documents for each dependent enrolled in the plan, including name, Associate ID, last four digits of SSN, and phone number on the cover page of your submission. Financial information and SSNs may be blacked out except for the last four digits of SSNs. Submit documentation via upload using the online enrollment system at myACI.Albertsons.com. From the **Me** page, click on the **Benefits** tile, then click on the **Pending Actions** tile. Select the name of the family member to whom the documentation applies and follow the onscreen instructions to upload the document.

All verification documents must be submitted within 31 days of your coverage effective date, or your dependents will be dropped from coverage as of your coverage effective date.

Spouse—Proof of Marital Status Options

Only a marriage certificate is required if married in the current calendar year.

<p>Child of Domestic Partner</p>	<p>One of the following documents showing domestic partner as the parent:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Birth certificate, certificate of live birth, hospital record, or paternity test • Divorce decree (must list dependent's name) • Court child support order (must list dependent's name) • Report of birth abroad of a citizen of the United States of America (issued by the Department of State) <p style="text-align: center;">AND</p> <p>Proof of current joint financial dependency that includes a copy of one of the following that shows both names on the document:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mortgage statement • Credit card statement • Bank statement • Rental/lease agreement • Property tax statement from last twelve (12) months • Domestic partner affidavit

Legally Adopted	<p>Court-approved adoption papers (with signature or seal), including adoption placement agreement and petition of adoption; must include dependent's name</p>
Legal Guardianship	<p>Court-awarded legal guardianship papers (must list dependent's name) showing:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You have been granted guardianship under state law • You (your spouse) are the child's legal guardian • Your signature or court seal/stamp
Disabled	<p>Proof of parent/child relationship as listed above</p> <p style="text-align: center;">AND</p> <p>One of the following documents:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Disability certificate from the insurance carrier—contact medical carrier for forms; to be eligible to continue, disability had to occur before age 26 • Social Security paperwork indicating the dependent is currently receiving disability benefits
